## Traditional Troops:

Groups of Girl Scouts, typically meet weekly or biweekly for an hour or two. Guided by adult volunteers—often parents and caregivers—girls select exciting hands-on activities and projects, try new things, and cheer each other on. Together, they earn badges to reflect their successes and show the world what they're made of.

## Starter Troops:

Short-term, staff-led troops in areas where there are interested girls, but not yet viable volunteers. Girls participate in regular troop activities with the end goal to develop a sustainable volunteer-led troop.
